SETTING THE STAGE

- •Have students hold up the hand they write with. Explain that this is their dominant hand.
 - •Discuss the difference between dominant and non-dominant.
 - •Ask students to write their name with their non-dominant hand. Does it look the same as when they write with their dominant hand?

PROCEDURE

Students will play in groups of 2-6 players.

Play Staxis as set out by the instructions, but students are only allowed to use their NON dominant hand. The dominant hand should be held behind their back.
