## The Power of Choices!



*Bunny Bedtime* is a game of choices. The duck or the boat? The green or yellow toothbrush? Do you want to take the next turn or should I? A 2-year-old's world is full of choices being made for him. The clothes he wears, the time he goes to bed, what he eats. Offering him age-appropriate choices is empowering—and is potentially a way to curb the “NOs!” he might be fond of saying! Bunny Bedtime gives your 2-year-old the chance to be in control of Bunny's choices, a great practice for his blossoming independence. Play Bunny Bedtime in the morning, before bed, or any time your child wants to spend a few

## INSTRUCTIONS

Includes: game board • 5 puzzle pieces • 1 die • 1 Bunny mover



**It's time for bed, Bunny!**  
Can you help Bunny make the choices she needs to get ready for bed?

### Set Up

- Unfold and set out the game board.
- Place Bunny at the start of the path in her room.
- Place the five puzzle pieces and the die near the board.



### How to Play

1. Roll the die.
2. Move Bunny along the path to the next space of the indicated color.
3. Read the story in the space above Bunny and find the puzzle piece that matches the shape. Look at both sides of the piece and choose your favorite! Place the piece in the board.



Take turns until all the puzzle pieces have been placed, then roll the die one last time and put Bunny to bed!

If Bunny stops on a space in a section where the puzzle has already been placed, roll again and move Bunny to the next section.

### Who Wins?

No one wins or loses in Bunny Bedtime.



## EXTEND THE PLAY AND LEARNING

There are more ways to play, learn, explore, and connect with Bunny Bedtime!



### Build Reading Skills!

**Read It!** Left-to-right progression, the process of moving the eyes or hands from left to right, is an important pre-reading skill. Invite your child to place his finger or the Bunny on each section of the story sequence as you read it to him. He might even want to try to “read” it himself!

**Play House!** The exterior of the playing board is an excellent backdrop for imaginative play. Stand it up and add other small toy figures you already have as “friends” visiting Bunny’s home. Pretend you are Bunny or one of the friends and encourage your child to do the same. Model conversational language as you and your child play.

### Practice Sequencing!

**Be Bunny!** After you have played the game a few times, invite your child to act out Bunny’s bedtime routine when he goes to bed. Use the board to guide your child in the same sequence of bathing, potty, pajamas, etc. Encourage him to make choices too.
